

Ecclesall Road and Hunter's Bar area - 1



The row of shops at Hunter's Bar belonging to Herbert Nicholson. I think the small William Hill shop is number 661, the shop that is listed as Herbert Nicholson, tobacconist in the 1901 White's Directory. His other tobacconist entry is 434 Ecclesall Road now called Liquorice. (Top two pictures by Adrian Harris in 2005)



Hunter's Bar, Boots the Chemist is just showing above the lorry. The area was first built on around the end of the nineteenth century as the residential part of the city expanded upwind away from the industrial centre.



Sharrow Vale Road at Hunter's Bar. It is on the site of a nineteenth century dam and water wheel for grinding knives. It leads up the hill to the General Cemetery.

Ecclesall Road and Hunter's Bar area - 2



Sheffield High School (Girls Day School Trust) which is a walk away up the hill from Rustlings Road and Hunter's Bar towards the pleasant residential area, Broomhill, where many of the Nicholsons lived in the late nineteenth century.



The main part of the walk is up Brocco Bank. This is the view back down towards Rustlings Road and Hunter's Bar
